Stadium Code of Conduct

effective from 18 December 2024

1. Purpose of this Stadium Code of Conduct

- 1.1. This Stadium Code of Conduct ("**Stadium Code of Conduct**") applies to all matches (each a "**Match**") of the FIFA Club World Cup 2025™ ("**Competition**"). The Stadium Code of Conduct has been prepared by Fédération Internationale de Football Association ("**FIFA**") and FIFA's local subsidiary in the United States of America, FWC2026 US, Inc. ("**FIFA US**"), in partnership with the stadiums hosting the Competition.
- 1.2. This Stadium Code of Conduct applies to all areas of a stadium used in connection with the Competition, including the stadium building and surrounding premises, facilities, spaces, entrances and exits owned or controlled by the stadium authority ("**Stadium**") to which a valid Competition Match ticket ("**Ticket**") or accreditation device ("**Accreditation**") is required for entry.
- 1.3. Each person on the grounds of the Stadium ("**Attendee**") and each person using a ticket to gain access to the Stadium ("**Ticket Holder**") are required to adhere to this Stadium Code of Conduct at all times whilst at the Stadium. Any person granted access to the Stadium by an Accreditation ("**Accredited Person**") must also adhere to this Stadium Code of Conduct to the extent it does not conflict with their official duties or terms and conditions applicable to them as an Accredited Person.
- 1.4. Throughout the period that a Ticket or Accreditation is required to enter the Stadium, this Stadium Code of Conduct replaces, or takes precedence over (where applicable), any other rules or regulations of the same or similar subject matter which may be applicable to the Stadium during other periods.
- 1.5. This Stadium Code of Conduct may be enforced by FIFA, FIFA US and the respective Stadium management, including their officers, employees, representatives, volunteers, security personnel, stewards and administrators, or any third parties contracted to provide services to the Stadium management (collectively the "**Event Organisers**") as well as any public authorities in charge of safety, security and public order at the Stadium including police or other applicable law-enforcement and emergency services officials.
- 1.6. All instructions given by Event Organizers, public authorities in charge of safety, security, and public order in the Stadium, and/or security personnel (public or private) must be followed by all Attendees, Ticket Holders and Accredited Persons.
- 1.7. To ensure the highest security and safety standards at the Competition, the Stadium Code of Conduct may be modified or revised by FIFA or FIFA US at any time. The latest and effective



version is available online at [FIFA.com/tickets](https://www.fifa.com/tickets) and will be available at different locations (as determined by the Event Organisers) throughout the Stadium on Match days, in locations such as FIFA ticketing centres and Stadium entry points. In addition, the Event Organisers reserve the right to develop additional policies specific to different categories of Ticket Holder and/or Accredited Person based on prevailing security measures and/or risk assessments.

- 1.8. IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF ANY ATTENDEE, THE TICKET HOLDER, AND ACCREDITED PERSON TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE AWARE OF AND COMPLY WITH THE LATEST AND EFFECTIVE VERSION OF THE STADIUM CODE OF CONDUCT AND OTHER ADDITIONAL POLICIES DESCRIBED IN CLAUSE 1.7 ABOVE PRIOR TO ARRIVING AT, AND WHILST INSIDE, THE STADIUM.
- 1.9. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THIS STADIUM CODE OF CONDUCT MAY RESULT IN REMOVAL FROM THE STADIUM AND/OR CANCELLATION OR REVOCATION OF TICKET(S) OR ACCREDITATION. ANY PERSON THAT IS DEEMED A SECURITY RISK BY THE EVENT ORGANISERS, POLICE OR OTHER EMERGENCY SERVICES OFFICIALS MAY ALSO BE SUBJECT TO CIVIL OR CRIMINAL FINES AND PENALTIES.

2. Stadium Access

- 2.1. A Ticket Holder, or Accredited Person may only access the Stadium via the entrances indicated on their Ticket or Accreditation (if applicable) or as otherwise directed by the Event Organisers outside the Stadium. Access to the Stadium is only permitted upon presentation of a valid Ticket, Accreditation and/or any other access device that may be expressly approved by FIFA or FIFA US in writing. Ticket Holders who leave the Stadium after entry will not be permitted to re-enter the Stadium except in exceptional circumstances (for example, medical emergencies) as determined by representatives of FIFA or FIFA US (such as FIFA's security and safety personnel) in their sole discretion.
- 2.2. Ticket Holders may enter the Stadium on the date of the Match, and no earlier than the time indicated by Event Organizers or on their respective Ticket, which remains subject to change at the discretion of the Event Organisers. Attendees, Ticket Holders, and Accredited Persons must promptly exit the Stadium following the conclusion of the Match, unless permitted as part of their Ticket or Accreditation, or if instructed otherwise by the Event Organisers, police or other emergency services officials.
- 2.3. All persons entering the Stadium must pass through safety and security screening at the point of entry. The Event Organisers are authorised to determine – including through the use of technical aids – whether any person entering the Stadium represents a security risk and/or is in possession of any item prohibited under this Stadium Code of Conduct. Permission to enter, or to remain inside, the Stadium is at the absolute discretion of the Event Organisers and/or police or other applicable law enforcement and emergency services officials.
- 2.4. Inside the Stadium, Ticket Holders must ensure that their Ticket is available for inspection at the request of the Event Organisers at any time. Accredited Persons must also ensure that their Accreditations are available for inspection at the request of the Event Organisers at any time.



Accreditations and/or any other access devices must remain visible at all times. Accreditations must be by worn around the neck with the side identifying the Accredited Person facing outwards, or as otherwise instructed by FIFA or FIFA US. For the avoidance of doubt, an Accredited Person without a valid Ticket should not occupy a seat.

- 2.5. Ticket Holders are only permitted to bring certain types of bags into Stadiums. These approved bags must be clear and made of plastic, vinyl, or PVC material. The purpose of clear bags is to allow security personnel to easily see the contents inside without having to open them. Those bags must not exceed 12 inches x 6 inches x 12 inches (30 cm x 30 cm x 15 cm). Additionally, small clutch purses or wallets approximately the size of a hand are allowed, even if not clear and no larger than 4.5 inches x 6.5 inches (or 11cm x 16.5cm).

3. Prohibited Items

- 3.1. The following items are strictly prohibited at all times in the Stadium unless expressly authorised by the Event Organisers, where appropriate (such as Accredited Person acting in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions of their Accreditation):

Hazardous Items

- 3.1.1. weapons of any kind (including for self-defence), ammunition or components of guns, piercing or bladed items, electric incapacitation devices (Tasers, stun guns, etc...), mace, pepper spray, or other chemical irritants;
- 3.1.2. explosives, detonators and items containing or concealing such prohibited items;
- 3.1.3. any other object which could be used as a weapon, to cut, or to stab, or as a projectile, or any object which could in the opinion of the Event Organisers endanger the safety of others, including golf umbrellas or beach umbrellas, motorcycle helmets, hard hats and other similar objects;
- 3.1.4. work tools of any kind;
- 3.1.5. body protection gear or corsets (unless permitted upon presentation of a medical prescription), including bullet-proof vests and items used in martial arts or extreme sports;
- 3.1.6. helmets as well as any other means of disguise or items specifically designed for concealing a person's identity, except for religious headwear, medical masks and face shields. Any permitted face covering must be removed upon request of the Event Organisers (for example, for the purposes of access and security screening);
- 3.1.7. except for cigarettes and electronic smoking devices (including those that heat tobacco), (which may be possessed but not used within the Stadium), any materials, articles or objects (including self-made items), the use of which can result in the generation of smoke, heat and/or flames including lighters, matches, fireworks, flares, smoke bombs and other smoke-emitting articles, compressed and liquefied gases, combustible solids, poisonous or noxious or pungent substances, oxidising substances and organic peroxides;
- 3.1.8. toxic, radioactive, caustic or corrosive materials;
- 3.1.9. spray cans, corrosive and flammable substances, large permanent marker pens, paints or receptacles containing substances that are harmful to health or highly flammable;
- 3.1.10. aerosol cylinders, thermoses and flasks of any kind;



- 3.1.11. bottles, cups, jars, cans or any other form of closed or capped receptacle that may be thrown or cause injury, as well as other objects made of glass or any other breakable material or especially hard packages or hard thermal boxes (for the avoidance of doubt, empty, transparent, reusable plastic bottles, up to and a one (l) litre/33.8 oz. capacity, may be brought into the Stadium);
- 3.1.12. sports equipment items (excluding clothing) such as inflatable balls, regardless of size, darts, and frisbees;
- 3.1.13. other inflated or inflatable items, such as balloons (deflated footballs purchased on game day at a FIFA venue will be permitted);
- 3.1.14. strollers, bicycles, rollerblades, skateboards, kick scooters and electric scooters;
- 3.1.15. large items such as stairs, benches, folding chairs, boxes, cardboard containers. 'Large' means any objects for which the sum of three dimensions of length, width and height exceeds 75 centimetres/29.5 inches and which cannot be stored under a seat in the Stadium;
- 3.1.16. non-transparent bags, backpacks, large purses, camera bags, seat cushions with pockets, zippers, compartments or covers, and other similar items are generally prohibited. Fans attempting to bring such bags into stadiums may be asked to take it to the deposits or dispose of them before entering.
- 3.1.17. significant quantities of paper or any rolls of paper;
- 3.1.18. any quantities of powdery materials, flour or similar substances (small make up elements, such as compact powder, shadows, blush, lipsticks, glosses and other are permitted);
- 3.1.19. any type of animal, except for service animals.

Food / Liquids / Consumable Items

- 3.1.20. With the exception of hand sanitizers, no larger than 100ml/3.38 oz., any liquids containing alcohol, including any alcoholic beverages, unless purchased and consumed within designated areas of the Stadium and in strict accordance with any additional alcohol consumption rules imposed by the Event Organisers;
- 3.1.21. any other liquids exceeding 100ml/3.38 oz. unless such liquids are purchased inside the Stadium, with the exception of (i) baby milk and sterilised water in containers (including in glass containers) not exceeding 1 litre/33.8 oz. per child, and (ii) liquids up to 500 millilitres/16.9 oz. that are required for medical reasons but only if presented with a medical certificate in English or Spanish and in the presence of the person for whom they are intended;
- 3.1.22. food items of any kind, except if acquired inside the Stadium or if they are medically required or for babies or young infants (not exceeding 1 litre/33.8 oz. per child). Food items required for medical reasons will only be permitted inside the Stadium if presented with a medical certificate in English or Spanish and in the presence of the person for whom they are intended. Any permitted food items must be packed in receptacles that are not made out of glass or otherwise in contravention of this Stadium Code of Conduct;
- 3.1.23. drugs, narcotics or stimulants of any kind, except substances necessary for medical reasons if presented with a medical certificate in English or Spanish and in the presence of the person for whom they are intended. Medications that are not prohibited or restricted by applicable federal and/or local laws are permitted in quantities not



exceeding a single package of more than 7 different medicines (in any form, including aerosols, drops, syringes, etc.) and must be in factory packaging.

Flags and Political / Offensive / Commercial Items

- 3.1.24. any materials, including but not limited to banners, flags, fliers, apparel and other paraphernalia, that are of a political, offensive and/or discriminatory nature, containing wording, symbols or any other attributes aimed at discrimination of any kind against a country, private person or group on account of race, skin colour, ethnicity, national or social origin, gender identity and expression, disability, language, religion, political opinion or any other opinion, birth, wealth or any other status, sexual orientation or on any other grounds;
- 3.1.25. flags, banners and posters except those that do not exceed 2 meters x 1.5 meters (78 inches x 60 inches) or unless approved in advance by the Event Organisers in writing, provided in all cases that such flags, banners or posters are made of a non-flammable material, and are not in any other way prohibited under this Stadium Code of Conduct. All such items must be presented at the Stadium entrance for inspection by the Event Organisers;
- 3.1.26. flagpoles, pom-pom shakers with stick handles, or banner poles of any kind, with the exception of flexible poles or double poles made from non-flammable plastic that do not exceed 1 meter/39.3 in. long and 1 centimetre/0.39 in. in diameter and are not otherwise deemed a safety risk by the Event Organisers;
- 3.1.27. any promotional or commercial object, apparel or other material including, but not limited to, banners, flags, signs, symbols and flyers or any type of object, material or clothing that, in the opinion of the Event Organisers, are promotional or commercial in nature.

Electronic, Musical and Telecommunication Items

- 3.1.28. radio-electronic or high frequency devices, or any other devices that may lead to an interruption or failure of broadcasting or IT functionality at the Stadium;
- 3.1.29. any musical instruments (mechanical or manual) that cannot be fully visualized by security or that are larger than 12cm x 12cm x 12cm (4.7 inches x 4.7 inches x 4.7 inches). Ticket Holders may bring musical instrument larger than the indicated size subject to preapproval of the Event Organisers and security screening. The applicable Event Organiser may require Ticket Holders to stop using musical instruments if the sound emitting from the respective device interferes with event operations or the enjoyment of other Ticket Holders;
- 3.1.30. electronic, mechanical or manual devices that produce noise or other excessively loud sounds, such as vuvuzelas, whistles, air horns, loudspeakers, etc. Heaters for drums are also prohibited. The Event Organisers may require Ticket Holders to stop using devices permitted inside the Stadium if the sound emitting from the respective device interferes with event operations or the enjoyment of other Ticket Holders;
- 3.1.31. instruments that emit laser beams, laser pointers or similar emissions;
- 3.1.32. any type of television and telecommunication equipment (including professional video cameras) or other professional equipment that is capable of recording sound and video;



- 3.1.33. more than one set of extra batteries or rechargeable units for any device which is permitted under this Stadium Code of Conduct. One (1) personal use power bank, not large than 12 cm x 17cm (4.7 inches x 6.7 inches) permitted per person;
- 3.1.34. any types of mounts for photo and video equipment, such as tripods, monopods and 'selfie' sticks;
- 3.1.35. drones, unmanned aircraft systems and any remote-controlled aircraft;
- 3.1.36. large binoculars (except if used by partially-sighted Ticket Holders and other optical magnifying equipment, except photographic camera lenses for non-professional purposes).

Other Prohibited Items

- 3.1.37. any other objects that may compromise public safety, cause nuisance and/or harm the Competition's reputation, as determined by the Event Organisers at their absolute discretion.
- 3.2. Depending on the Stadium holders of a wheelchair user Ticket may be required to bring their own wheelchair or mobility scooter in order to access the Stadium. For any questions in respect of this Clause 3.2, Ticket Holders should contact FIFA via www.FIFA.com/tickets.
 - 3.3. Inside the Stadium, Accessibility Ticket Holders are permitted to use manual or electric wheelchairs or mobility scooters with either three or four wheels, a maximum width of 70 centimetres (28 inches) and length of 130 centimetres (51 inches), a maximum turning radius of 90 centimetres (35 inches) and turning width of 150 centimetres (60 inches), and a maximum speed of 6 kilometres (3.7 miles) per hour. For safety and security reasons, wheelchairs or mobility scooters exceeding any of these restrictions are not permitted inside the Stadium.
 - 3.4. Notwithstanding the terms in this Section 3, the Event Organisers reserve the ultimate right to make a final decision on whether any item brought to or into the Stadium is prohibited and any decision must be respected. Attendees, Ticket Holders, or Accredited Persons who do not comply with the Event Organiser's final decision may be refused entry to, or removed from, the Stadium.

4. Behaviour at the Stadium

- 4.1. Unless expressly authorised by the Event Organisers, where appropriate, such as in respect of Accredited Persons acting in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions of their Accreditation, all persons entering, inside and exiting the Stadium must:
 - 4.1.1. conduct themselves in a way that does not cause harm, injury, danger, unnecessary obstruction, alarm or discomfort to others, and does not cause any damage to property;
 - 4.1.2. follow any and all instructions given by the Event Organisers, police or other emergency services officials or officers;
 - 4.1.3. access only the Stadium areas permitted by their Ticket, or the Stadium areas determined by the function for which they hold an Accreditation, and they must access these areas only by the designated entrance(s), unless instructed otherwise by the relevant Event Organisers;



- 4.1.4. vacate their designated or occupied seat if instructed to do so by the relevant Event Organisers on grounds of safety and security;
 - 4.1.5. dispose of waste correctly, according to the multi-bin system provided at the Stadium (if made available within the Stadium); and
 - 4.1.6. take reasonable steps to inform the Event Organisers, police or other emergency services officials if they become aware of an accident in or immediately surrounding the Stadium or any damage caused to any Stadium property.
- 4.2. Unless expressly authorised by the Event Organisers, where appropriate, such as in respect of Accredited Persons acting in accordance with the applicable terms and conditions of their Accreditation, all persons entering, inside and exiting the Stadium must not:
- 4.2.1. bring to, or store at, the Stadium any items prohibited under this Stadium Code of Conduct or any other applicable laws, policies and procedures;
 - 4.2.2. enter the field of play or areas immediately surrounding the field of play;
 - 4.2.3. throw objects, substances or liquids of any kind, in particular towards another person or in the direction of the field of play or the area surrounding the field of play;
 - 4.2.4. start a fire, release or throw fireworks, flares, guns, smoke bombs or other smoke devices, pyrotechnic devices, or other devices that produce similar effects;
 - 4.2.5. restrict, obstruct or block passages, gangways, staircases and streets, entrances and exits to the Stadium, access to seating areas and emergency exits, or obstruct or interfere with open zones to traffic, or otherwise act in a way that could cause crowding in a manner that creates a risk of a stampede or public disturbance;
 - 4.2.6. access, or facilitate access for others to, areas that are closed to the public or to which access is not authorised to Ticket Holders or under the terms and conditions of Accreditation, such as Stadium operations rooms, VIP and hospitality facilities, press rooms, etc.;
 - 4.2.7. engage in any anti-social behaviour, promote any violent, intimidating, threatening or damaging behaviour, or behave in such a way oneself, or demonstrate tendency to behave oneself in a violent, indecent, threatening and harmful manner or one that may disturb the public order or cause offence to a reasonable person;
 - 4.2.8. act in a manner that may be perceived as dangerous, provocative, threatening, offensive and/or discriminatory or may cause a person to fear for their safety;
 - 4.2.9. intimidate, bother, harass physically, sexually and /or mentally abuse any other person, including players and officials involved in the Match;
 - 4.2.10. create or do any act that can pose any threat to life to oneself or others, or hurt or injure any person in any way;
 - 4.2.11. stand on seats in the spectator areas or unreasonably obstruct the view of Ticket Holders in any way, including standing in Stadium areas reserved for spectators with disabilities and limited mobility;
 - 4.2.12. climb structures and installations prohibited for general use, such as closed fences, walls, wire fences, barriers, light poles, camera platforms, trees, pools or roof tops;
 - 4.2.13. use clothing or other items to conceal the face or obstruct the person's identity, other than face masks worn for health or medical purposes, or national, cultural and religious headwear;

- 4.2.14. curse or chant in a political, offensive and/or discriminatory manner or use foul or abusive language or obscene gestures;
- 4.2.15. act in an offensive or obscene manner by streaking, flashing, removing items of clothing or otherwise remain in a state of undress or reveal intimate body parts. For the avoidance of doubt, body tattoos and body paint do not constitute clothing.
- 4.2.16. be visibly under the influence of alcohol, narcotics or any narcotic substance. Alcohol may only be consumed in moderation, in strict accordance with any additional alcohol consumption rules imposed by the Event Organisers and always in accordance with United States of America's applicable laws with respect to age limits and other restrictions. Alcohol must not be offered to persons under the legal drinking age (note, if there are reasonable grounds to believe that someone is intoxicated as a result of alcohol and/or drug consumption, that person may be refused certain services and may be refused access to, or removed from, the Stadium);
- 4.2.17. relieve themselves in any place other than a designated toilet, or litter in the Stadium by dropping objects such as trash, packaging, empty containers, etc.;
- 4.2.18. smoke, vape or use any tobacco products as well as any electronic smoking device anywhere other than within outdoor designated smoking areas if they have been made available at the Stadium and otherwise provided that applicable medical and safety protocols permit such activity;
- 4.2.19. damage vegetation, gardens, landscaping, cultural or natural heritage sites;
- 4.2.20. use devices that generate excessive noise or that interfere with the playing or viewing of football matches, excluding devices approved by the Event Organisers as being intended for expressing support for football teams and players participating in the Competition;
- 4.2.21. practise any other conduct or organise such conduct that may interfere with the comfort, safety or enjoyment of the Competition for any other Ticket Holder, Accredited Person, player or Match official, or that may disrupt the sporting nature of the Competition;
- 4.2.22. disrupt or interfere with the operation of Stadium utilities, including power supply, lighting (including emergency lighting), ventilation, water supply, sewerage, air conditioning or any other systems;
- 4.2.23. secure/fix flags, banners or posters to surfaces of structures and installations at the Stadium, cover CCTV cameras or air conditioning systems, place flags, banners or posters on the pitch-side perimeter walls (unless permitted otherwise by the Event Organisers), or otherwise use flags for any reason other than in a festive and friendly manner. Upon the request of the Event Organisers, Ticket Holders must immediately remove, stop demonstrating and/or permit the confiscation of any flags, banners or posters;
- 4.2.24. write, paint or post anything on structural elements, installations or passages;
- 4.2.25. possess, use, display, disseminate, promote or transmit any materials (including but not limited to banners, flags, fliers, apparel and other paraphernalia) of a political, offensive and/or discriminatory nature, containing wording, symbols or any other attributes aimed at race, skin colour, ethnicity, national or social origin, gender identity and expression, disability, language, religion, political opinion or any other opinion, birth, wealth or any other status, sexual orientation or any other grounds;



- 4.2.26. sell or offer to sell any goods or Tickets (in violation of applicable FIFA ticketing terms and location legislation), display, gather and/or distribute materials (including printed materials such as flyers, booklets and publications, advertising materials and apparel) or any objects whatsoever, raise funds or conduct other promotional or commercial activities without the prior written consent of FIFA or FIFA26 US (including demonstrating discernible brands or trademarks of legal entities or individuals for advertising purposes) nor conduct any other types of promotional or propaganda activities;
 - 4.2.27. solicit donations in cash or in kind (including but not limited to musicians, singers or collectors of charitable donations at the Stadium surroundings or on Stadium premises) without written authorisation from the Event Organisers;
 - 4.2.28. conduct any activities relating to gambling, betting or court siding, including wagering of money or value-in-kind on an event and/or Match with an uncertain outcome;
 - 4.2.29. conduct any activities related to predicting or attempting to predict sport results for financial gain;
 - 4.2.30. relay and/or transmit, via mobile or other devices, the live Match scores or any other activity related to the Competition or information about Match activities that is announced via the public address system and/or giant screens located within the Stadium;
 - 4.2.31. practise any other activities that may compromise public safety and/or harm the reputation of the Competition, the Event Organisers or any public authorities in charge of safety, security and public order at the Stadium, as determined by the Event Organisers in their discretion;
 - 4.2.32. take any photographs of any staff of Event Organisers or other security personnel wearing uniforms or any security procedures.
- 4.3. These lists of obligatory and prohibited actions and behaviour are not exhaustive. The Event Organisers reserve the right to make a final decision on whether any behaviour within the Stadium is prohibited, which must be respected. Ticket Holders or Accredited Persons who do not comply with the Event Organisers' final decision may be refused entry to, or removed from, the Stadium.
